Children are entitled to a free school lunch and I will need to order this by Tuesday 4th July. Please let me know via Tapestry or at the end of the school day if you do wish to order a school lunch. I recommend that you follow all the usual healthy eating options as usual for a school lunch and no sweets or nuts are permitted.

We have plenty of staff joining us on the trip so no parent helpers are required this time. Thank you for all the offers. We are really looking forward to our day out.
