The Scholastic Book Fair will be taking place on Tuesday 14th, Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th November. This is an excellent opportunity to buy books for Christmas presents. The books provided by Scholastic are of very good quality and will make excellent gifts. There are over 200 titles to choose from and prices start from only £2.99.

You can purchase books in 3 ways:

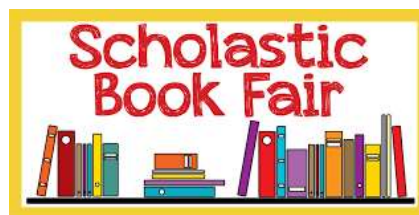
1. The book fair will be open Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoon from 3.25pm until 4.15pm in the phonics hub so you can visit the fair with your children and purchase books using cash or a credit/debit card.
2. The children will go with their class teacher during the week to look at the books. If they see any books they would like to buy, they or their class teacher can make a note of the title and price. If you then put the correct amount of money into an envelope, they can purchase a book.
3. Some books are very popular and so sell out quickly, therefore if you want a book that is no longer available to buy, please speak to Mrs. Wheeler directly at the book fair. Payments must be made on the date of ordering and you should receive your book up to a week after the event.

Could you please make sure that all envelopes are labelled with your child's name and class, book title or titles and the amount of money contained. The school receives a rising percentage of commission depending on the amount of books we sell, therefore the more we sell, the more books we will receive in commission. This is a great way of supplementing our resources, especially as we are trying to develop the reading books in our school library and classrooms. We would be very appreciative if you could support us.

As we are keen to build upon the reading material we currently have in our library, we would be extremely grateful if you would like to purchase a book from the fair and donate it to our school library. Each book purchased, will contain a sticker acknowledging who has kindly donated it.

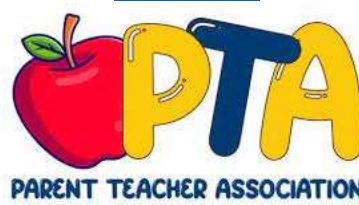

SENDLO – Website Update



The Local Authority have launched a new website for Wirral's Local Offer of SEND Services called 'SENDLO.' SENDLO brings together information about the local services and support available across education, health and social care for families with children and young people aged 0 to 25, who have special educational needs and/or disabilities.

As part of the launch of the new Local Offer website SENDLO, Wirral SEND are hosting an event that will help really bring SENDLO to life and signpost families to what is on offer in Wirral. The aim is that parents and carers will leave better informed, supported and be confident that they have a go to place for answers and/or signposting. SENDLO Live will take place on **23rd November from 1pm-8pm at the Floral Pavilion, New Brighton.**

There will be a massive marketplace of services across Health, Education and Social Care. Third sector organisations will also be playing a key role in the day with Parent/Carer volunteers on hand to engage with families.

There will also be live dance performances from our SEND young people, workshops, demos, opportunities to 'have your say' and lots more. There will also be a sensory room for visitors who may find the noise, lighting, number of people a tad overwhelming.
